Garbage Service

Garbage Day is Thursday

- Please have your household garbage at curbside by 8:00 a.m.
The limit is (2) bags per household per week.

The following garbage is not accepted:

- Building/demolition materials
Yard trimmings
Animal waste/ carcasses
Batteries/tires
Household paint/ chemicals/hazardous materials/oils
Ashes/sawdust










Commercial Bins

Commercial Properties are reminded that bins for your use are located in a fenced area on Poplar Street (behind the Works Yard). To gain access you must obtain the key from the Village Office. Office hours are 8:30 a.m. to noon, and 1:00 p.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday to Friday (except statutory holidays).

We would have no choice but to pass these fines back to the residents in the form of higher fees or even secession of this service.

2. GLASS	<p>All clear, green and brown food and beverage bottles and jars, including liquor and wine bottles.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> RINSE well REMOVE lids LABELS okay 	<p>NO broken glass NO mirrors NO glass cups NO china NO light bulbs NO light bulbs</p> 
3. NEWSPAPERS	<p>All newspapers and regular inserts and flyers.</p>	
4. CARDBOARD AND BOXBOARD	<p>Most cardboard boxes, brown paper bags and boxboard (ie. cereal, cracker, shoe boxes, etc.)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> REMOVE any liners FLATTEN larger cardboard boxes and tie in bundles not exceeding 60 cm (2 ft square) and placed under a 	<p>NO pizza boxes NO waxed cardboard NO milk cartons NO egg cartons or other press board NO boxes with plastic window or wrap</p> 
5. PLASTIC	  <p>PET HDPE</p>	<p>NO plastic bags NO food containers NO dairy/yogurt</p> 

Recyclables must be placed in see-through plastic bags and placed by the roadside. Cardboard must be bagged or tied in 2'x2' bundles.

A separate bag must be used for each of the five categories of recyclables

The gate is open from noon to 3:00 p.m. Monday to Friday and 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. Saturday and Sunday. We encourage mulching of grass to limit the amount of grass clippings in this area and reduce over watering of lawns.

Material Banned from the Bailey Sanitary Landfill

Disposal Fees at Bailey Sanitary Landfill

The following materials are banned from the Bailey Sanitary Landfill:

- Hazardous waste
- Special waste as defined by the BC Ministry of Environment
- Biomedical waste, sharps or infectious materials
- Flammable, combustible or oxidizing materials
- Materials that can be recycled through the Municipal Recycling Depots or through the curbside recycling program
- Beverage containers recyclable through the Expanded Beverage Container Deposit System
- Trees, stumps, or large logs (exceeding 15 centimeters in diameter)
- Rubber tires
- Motor vehicle bodies and farm implements
- Carcasses, offal or viscera
- Semi-solid and liquid waste (raw sewage, septic tank sludge, grease trappings)
- Industrial or commercial spools
- Any single item larger than 3 cubic metres
- Waste oil, oil filters or oil containers



<u>Type of Material</u>	<u>Fee*</u>	<u>Unit</u>
General Refuse (weighing 0-60 kg)	\$4.50	per vehicle
General Refuse (weighing 61 kg to 5 tonne per load)	\$73.00	per metric tonne
General Refuse (weighing 5 tonne or more per load)	\$68.00	per metric tonne
Gypsum for Recycling (without prohibited contamination)	\$125.00	per metric tonne
Permitted Special Waste Surcharge (Waste Mgt. Branch Min. of Environment)	\$200.00	per manifest

* rounded up to the nearest \$0.10 where applicable
