## A bylaw to amend the Water Regulation Bylaw No. 967

**WHEREAS** the Village of Harrison Hot Spring has deemed it advisable to amend Water Regulation Bylaw No. 967;

**NOW THEREFORE** in open meeting assembled, the Mayor and Council of the Village of Harrison Hot Springs enacts as follows:

#### 1. CITATION

This Bylaw may be cited for all purposes as the "Village of Harrison Hot Springs Water Regulation and Fee Amendment Bylaw No. 999, 2012".

## 2. TEXT AMENDMENT

- a. THAT Water Regulation Bylaw No. 967 be amended to read; "Village of Harrison Hot Springs Water Regulation and Fee Amendment Bylaw No. 980, 2012"; and
- **b.** THAT on page 4 under Section 4 Service Connection and Disconnection 4.2, be amended by adding "If the owner does not connect, a user fee will be applied against that property, on the same basis of similar class properties connected to the Village's water system."; and
- **c.** THAT Schedule "A" to Water Regulation Bylaw No. 967, 2011 is hereby repealed in its entirety and replaced with Schedule "A" attached hereto and forming part of this bylaw.

## 1. Sanitary Sewer Service Utility Fee:

All properties identified by folio numbers that are or can be connected to the sanitary sewer system will pay the following fee:

A. Class 1 Residential	\$ 175.00/per year
B. Class 6/8 Business and Recreational/ Non Profit	\$ 11.50/per metre based on the length of the property able to connect to the sewer service or a minimum fee of \$175.00 per year

C. Where the property has multiple property assessment class designation the fee will be based on the class 6/8 rate.

SUBJECT: Remediation of Village Office

On February 21, 2012, a Request For Quotes was issued to provide air quality remediation and renovation to the Village Office building. In response, the Village received three (3) quotes: Gerry Enns Contracting, Fictorie Construction Management Ltd. and Preview Builders International Inc.

The contractors were requested to quote on remediation/renovation based on recommendations provided in an Air Quality Assessment that was completed by Antiquity Environmental Consulting Ltd. that included:

- 1. Treatment for mould and prevention of air escape in crawlspace
- 2. Improvements to air quality including ducting, redesign and retrofit to existing HVAC system to include air purification, air filtration and disinfection
- 3. Treatment and control of pest infestation
- 4. Improved soffit venting and
- Removal of carpeting and installation of new 2.16 mm corlon sheet vinyl flooring

Staff met and reviewed the respective quotes. One of the quotes came in at \$84,387 plus HST and the other at \$95,056. Gerry Enns Contracting provided a quote for \$35,748.11 plus HST. Given the vast differences in quotes, staff met with a Gerry Enns Contracting representative to review the recommendations of the Air Quality Assessment report and to ensure all recommendations would be addressed.

Following this meeting, staff has concluded that the best value for money is Gerry Enns Contracting Ltd. The construction and remediation work can begin immediately and should take approximately one month to complete.

## RECOMMENDATION:

THAT Gerry Enns Contracting Ltd. be contracted to provide the remediation and renovation to the Village Office in the amount of \$35,748.11 plus HST.

## A bylaw authorizing the temporary transfer of monies in the Sewer Development Cost Charge Reserve Fund.

WHEREAS there is an unappropriated balance in the Sewer Development Cost Charge Reserve Fund of Six Hundred Sixty-Two Thousand One Hundred Sixty-Six (\$662,166) as at February 29, 2012 which amount has been calculated as follows:

Balance in Reserve Fund at December 31, 2011

\$974,506

Add: allocated from Bylaw No. 981

<313,000>

Interest earned to February 29, 2012

<u>660</u>

Uncommitted balance in reserve fund at February 29, 2012

\$662,166

**AND WHEREAS** it is deemed desirable to transfer a portion of the monies set aside under the Sewer Development Cost Charge Reserve Fund for the purpose of a temporary transfer to the general operating account for the purpose of paying draw No. 10 on the Village's Waste Water Treatment Plant and Collection System upgrade project;

**NOW THEREFORE** in open meeting assembled, the Mayor and Council of the Village of Harrison Hot Springs enacts as follows:

- a. The sum of Six Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$600,000) is hereby appropriated from the Sewer Development Cost Charge Reserve Fund to be transferred.
- b. The above amount shall be returned to the credit of the Development Cost Charge Reserve Fund upon receipt of funds from claim No. 6 of the Municipal Rural Infrastructure Fund (Wastewater Treatment Plant and Collection System Upgrade Project).
