## **MAYOR'S MESSAGE**



I don't remember a time when the word "unprecedented" was used so many times in one year. We experienced heat domes, atmospheric rivers, and an ongoing pandemic. The province was devastated by forest fires and flooding. All of these challenges had an affect on our community, neighbouring communities, friends and families. Our hearts go out to all who were affected.

To ensure that our residents had access to vaccines, on behalf of Council, I spent a significant amount of time this year advocating to the Province for the local COVID-19 Immunization Clinics which were set up in Agassiz and two pop-up clinics at our waterfront. I continue to advocate to the Province for assistance to our businesses who have been hardest hit by travel restrictions, road closures, fuel rationing, and cancelled events.

We are grateful to the Federal and Provincial Governments for grant funding under the Investing in Canada Infrastructure and Community Economic Recovery Infrastructure Programs which aided us in completing the Miami River Greenway, build a new walking trail on McCombs Drive (the official opening will take place in the new year) and begin on seismic upgrades to our Fire Hall. We also received two Provincial grants to build a berm and plaza with seating on the southwest side of the lagoon and assess the Harrison Lake Dike which protects the community against floodwaters originating with Harrison Lake. Quantifying and mapping local flood risk will help the Village evaluate the existing flood protection infrastructure and prioritize future flood management efforts like emergency response planning and land use planning. There has never been a more pressing time to undertake this review. We also received Resort Municipality Initiative funding that will be invested in further upgrades to the lagoon area. In total, we received over \$3.2M in funding this year!

To support the first ever National Day for Truth and Reconciliation, the Village Office was closed so that staff could have time to meaningfully reflect on the history and legacy of residential schools and honour Indigenous communities, families and survivors. Lights in the Civic Plaza were also installed and glowed orange for the duration of the night.

I am very proud of how we persevered this year and came together as a community. Please continue to watch out for one another and support our local businesses this season.

On behalf of Council, we wish our residents, businesses, visitors, and staff a Merry Christmas and Happy New Year!
