CAO Larry Burk provided clarification on the reason for the cutting of the trees behind the Lakeview Restaurant. A proper assessment was completed but the trees were classified as dangerous trees due to the damage from the wind storm.

Clarification of the definition of a wayfinding sign was given by Councillor Kenyon. It was questioned if this will remove other signs within the Village.

A member of the public spoke of the potential benefits of extended bus services for visitors to the area as well as residents of the Village. Councillor Kenyon commented on the cost of providing the bus service, CAO stated that the new bus on board will save us money in the long run but will not immediately increase bus service in the area.
