Marine Sanitation & Pump-Out Station

The Pump-Out Station is located on Harrison Lake adjacent to Rendall Park and the Boat Launch facility. This service is provided at no cost to users.

Section 13 of the Province's *Environmental Management Act*, prohibits the discharge of both black and greywater from any vessel into the water, unless specifically authorized.



Safety on the Water

Harrison Lake is the largest lake in the southern Coast Mountains of Canada. The lake is glacial fed and is about 60 km in length and at its widest almost 9 km across. The lake can be accessed by road or by boat at many points.



Weather and water conditions play a big role in your safety on the water. Before heading out on the lake, make sure you are updated on the latest forecast for your area and that you understand what it means. You should also be aware that Harrison Lake is known for its unpredictable weather conditions and like many other Canadian lakes, water temperatures can vary throughout the year.



Storms can also strike quickly and without warning, so keep your eye on the sky when you are out on the water. If it starts to look dark and cloudy, and conditions are changing quickly, head for shore. Remember to check your up-to-date nautical charts in advance so that you will know where to find shelter.
